Nature of support 2013/14

The Pupil Premium has been used mainly to support intervention programmes such as our 1 to 1 programme for pupils in Years 3-6, our Booster programmes for pupils in Years 5 to 6 and for extra Teaching Assistant hours in both our Key Stage 1 classes and for our Year 3 pupils.

We have used some of the PP to support our enrichment activities for pupils identified on the Gifted and Talented list throughout the year. In particular we have used the premium for individual music lesson.

We have used the funding to support our whole school focus on cooking and food technology lessons for every child in our dedicated food technology room.

We have also used this to provide Fundamental Skills in Key Stage 1 and intensive PE sessions in Key Stage 2.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2014/15

- In closing the gap in both literacy and numeracy for pupils in both Key Stages
- To enrich provision for our more able pupils
- To ensure that pupils have access to extended physical and musical activities

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of the autumn, spring and summer terms. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention. This will be shared with parents.

On average our pupils have made 4 AP over the year from an average of 19 to 23 points. All the pupils have moved forward.
